Ensemble actors / non-speaking parts

In Scenes 3 and 5, in Lyme Regis, there can be a number of townsfolk — men, women and children — who are milling around, perhaps looking at the fossil stall, patting Tray the dog and reacting to some of the action. Between five and twelve of these would be recommended.

In Scenes 2, 4 and 5, ensemble actors can be well-to-do members or supporters of the Geological Society, sitting or standing around in the lobby and singing either *Geological Society* or *On the Sidelines* with the main characters. Between three and six of various genders would be recommended — again, stand them in groups.

The Secretary and Treasurer of the Geological Society, as well as the Curator of the British Museum, could have a uniformed Clerk each who walks with them or at their side and holds their large book, bunch of keys, or some other official-looking prop.

To create more speaking/ solo singing parts

- Have two Ammonites – split the lines between two characters, thus four fossil-narrators in all;
- Have different urchins in Scene 1 and Scene 3 – creates two more small speaking parts;
- Have a new character, a friend of Henry De La Beche, who is the one who has made the 'Age of Reptiles' drawing rather than Henry. He would appear just in Scene 5, introduced by Thomas – so instead of saying, 'And in the meantime, Henry has something to show you', Thomas would say, 'And in the meantime, this is our friend, Samuel Cricket, who has something to show you!' – then Samuel says Henry's lines until 'share the credit and the money.' He should address Mary as 'Miss Anning' since he doesn't know her well. Creates one more speaking part, with 5 lines.
- Lady Harriet Sylvester could be transformed into sisters – they take half her lines each, and sing together.
- In Scene 6, create a few new lines for ensemble actors who are observing the goings-on as Edward meets his demise. These would be simple exclamations which react to the action – for example, 'What on earth is going on?!' when Albert and Humphrey arrive; 'This is quite extraordinary!' when Humphrey has described the crime; 'Shame on you!' when Edward and Wilhemina are found out; 'Good riddance, Geology has no need of crooks like you two!' when they are leaving, 'I can't bear the tension!' when the Secretary and Treasurer are checking the rules in their book, 'Come on Albert, do your duty!' when Albert is about to vote. This could create 6 new single-line parts. These people could also be given specific physical actions in the tableau in Scene 4.
- Increase the number of Coprolettes – 4 works well, but can be any number at all.
- Both verses of 'Hold on to your Friends' could be solos or group verses – by townsfolk or other friends of Molly/Tess – could create up to 8 new group singing parts.
This would create up to 11 more small speaking parts (41 in total), and 12 more group singing parts.

To produce the play with fewer actors

- Quarrymen can also play Geological Society Secretary / Treasurer.
- Joseph, Molly or Tray can also play Humphrey Hopeful.
- Quarrymen can also play Mr Marron and Cedric.
- Take out the part of Louisa and give her lines to Mr Marron.
- The Coprolettes can be doubled-up with any other characters except fossils (though they might need a quick change before Scene 6)
- Quarryman 1&2 can be combined into one person.
- Quarryman 3&4 can be combined into one person.
- The Geological Society Member's line can be said by Mr Marron.

The minimum number of actors is then 18.
